

**Are you an EU citizen living and working in Northern Ireland?**

## Settled Status

If you are an EU, EEA or Swiss citizen, and were living in the UK by 31 Dec 2020 now is the time to apply to the EU Settlement Scheme, you must apply to the scheme to continue living and working in the UK after **30 June 2021**.

If you have a permanent residence document you still need to apply.

Children also need their own application.

You can apply to the EU Settlement Scheme online at [gov.uk/eusettlement](https://www.gov.uk/eusettlement) It's **free** to apply.

The deadline for applying is currently **30 June 2021**.

**Are you Irish or British and live in the Republic of Ireland and come to work in Northern Ireland?**

## CTA

If you are Irish or British you can continue to come to work with no anticipated changes at this time. Your rights are protected under what is known as the Common Travel Area (CTA).

On 8 May 2019, the Irish and UK Governments signed a Memorandum of Understanding reaffirming the Common Travel Area and identifying the rights and privileges of Irish and UK citizens within the CTA.

It also reaffirms the commitment to maintain the CTA following Brexit.

## Frontier Worker

You need to apply to be a Frontier Worker, the Permit application process is free and can be done online from inside or outside the UK at [gov.uk/frontier-worker-permit/apply](https://www.gov.uk/frontier-worker-permit/apply)

Until 30 June 2021, you can continue entering the UK as a Frontier Worker using a valid passport or national identity card.

From 1 July 2021, you need to hold a valid Frontier Worker Permit, as well as a valid passport or national identity card to come to work.
