| <p>Does the EU EXIT affect me?</p> | <p>The EU Exit may affect you, it is important to read the information carefully at www.gov.uk/transition. The UK Government has developed an <u>online tool</u> to check if you will require a UK Visa and what action then needs to be taken. If you have a permanent residence document you still need to apply.</p> |
| <p>I am Irish, do I have to do anything?</p> | <p>Please note that there is no requirement to apply to the Settlement Scheme if you are an Irish Citizen, under the <u>Common Travel Area (CTA)</u>, this is a long-standing arrangement between the UK and Ireland that pre-dates both British and Irish membership of the EU and is not dependent on it.</p> |
| <p>I travel between NI and ROI what do I need?</p> | <p>If you hold an NI/ UK driving licence you will not need an International Driving Permit (IDP). You will need to carry your driving license. NI drivers (private and commercial) will need to carry a <u>physical Green Card</u> when travelling across the border into the ROI to prove they have valid insurance cover for their vehicle.</p> |
| <p>What is a frontier worker?</p> | <p>A Frontier Worker is someone who lives in the EU but works in the UK, for example EU Citizen living in ROI and working in NI. For more information on how to apply from inside or outside the UK https://www.gov.uk/frontier-worker-permit.</p> |
| <p>Will EA continue to employ EU nationals?</p> | <p>Yes. Our EU Colleagues work across the organisation to ensure our children and young people can be the best that they can be and are valued members of staff. | <p>What is settled status?</p> | <p>If you're an EU, EEA or Swiss citizen, you and your family can apply to the <u>EU Settlement Scheme</u> to continue living in the UK after 30 June 2021. You can apply if you're the family member of an eligible person of Northern Ireland. Children need their own application.</p> |
| <p>What is a sponsor licence?</p> | <p>EA need a <u>sponsor licence</u> to employ someone to work for us from outside the UK. This includes EU/ EEA citizens who arrived in the UK after 31 December 2020 and who do not have settled status.</p> |
